BACKGROUND

Evidence-based practice is a widely used problem-solving approach in the clinical setting, but it is also crucial to delivering patient-centered care. It integrates clinical expertise with the latest and best research evidence, along with known patient values, to deliver the best possible patient care.

The “patient-as-professional” (i.e. patient advocate) concept acknowledges the expert participation of patient advocates in multi-disciplinary professional teams, including their contributions to managing and coordinating patient care.

OBJECTIVE

This Roundtable seeks to understand the status of evidence-based patient-centered care globally, consider what trends and challenges might be faced in geriatric oncology going forward, and reflect on what role patient advocates could play to enhance the development and introduction of new clinical practices and novel medicines.
