



Instructions for clinical cases to be presented at SIOG Advanced Course in Geriatric Oncology

You will be requested to present one clinical case:

1. Either a first case of neoplasia in an initial stage for which surgery or radiotherapy has been considered or a case on a neoplasia in an advanced stage.
2. We encourage cases presentations on big killers such as breast, lung, colorectal, prostate cancer and malignant lymphomas.
3. Cases of hepatocarcinoma, gynecological neoplasia, head and neck carcinoma, non-prostate urological tumors (etc) are also welcome.
4. If you are a medical oncologist, a surgical oncologist or a radiotherapist, the case should be prepared with the contribution of a geriatrician. If you are a geriatrician, the case should be prepared with the contribution of a medical oncologist.
5. Give also the normal values or range when you present the results of a test (examples: MNA, GDS, MMS).
